

We are in negotiations to bring on additional advising capacity both through digital means and through additional staffing. During the last team visit, online student information about how to navigate was unavailable. DegreeWorks is a digital system tied into Banner that is supposed to provide an accurate and constantly updating map of where students are along their curricular path. The university has just contracted an external consultant to troubleshoot and find inaccuracies and other deficiencies in how it is coded to make it a trusted tool for students to use to understand where they are to maintain progress to degree.

Over the summer of 2023, the 7th floor of Weston Hall was renovated to increase the number of studio spaces in the building. More renovations are being planned on the 5th floor and possibly the 6th floor in the summer of 2024.

Additionally, we are piloting flexible studio space scheduling for those students who, in a few polls taken so far, have expressed they prefer to work at home, in and office, or elsewhere outside of scheduled studio hours to allow better use of the space we currently have and meet the desires of a portion of our upper level student body who prefer a mix of instructional modalities during the week. Some students have expressed an interest in having more flexibility in where and when they work during the week. We believe this will effectively free up more space to be available to those students who prefer to be in the building during a greater portion of the week.



We are in negotiations to bring on additional advising capacity both through digital means and through additional staffing. During the last team visit, online student information about how to navigate was unavailable. DegreeWorks is a digital system tied into Banner that is supposed to provide an accurate and constantly updating map of where students are along their curricular path. The university has just contracted an external consultant to troubleshoot and find inaccuracies and other deficiencies in how it is coded to make it a trusted tool for students to use to understand where they are to maintain progress to degree.

Over the summer of 2023, the 7th floor of Weston Hall was renovated to increase the number of studio spaces in the building. More renovations are being planned on the 5th floor and possibly the 6th floor in the summer of 2024.

Additionally, we are piloting flexible studio space scheduling for those students who, in a few polls taken so far, have expressed they prefer to work at home, in and office, or elsewhere outside of scheduled studio hours to allow better use of the space we currently have and meet the desires of a portion of our upper level student body who prefer a mix of instructional modalities during the week. Some students have expressed an interest in having more flexibility in where and when they work during the week. We believe this will effectively free up more space to be available to those students who prefer to be in the building during a greater portion of the week.
